

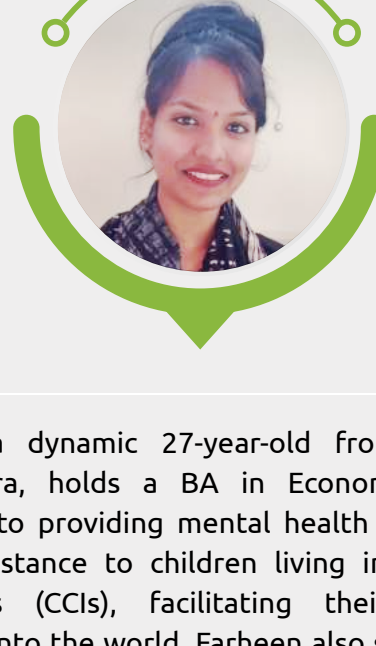

Kamal Bhargav



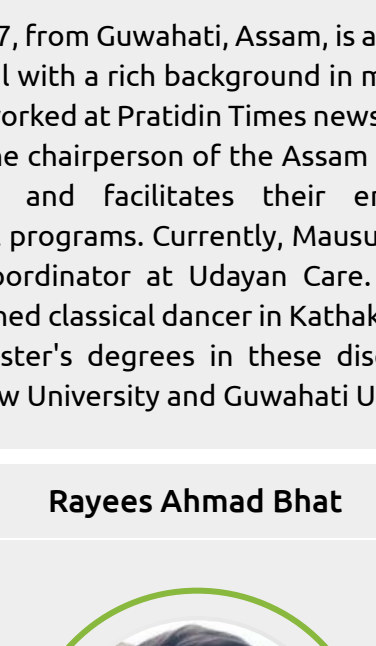

Farheen Khan



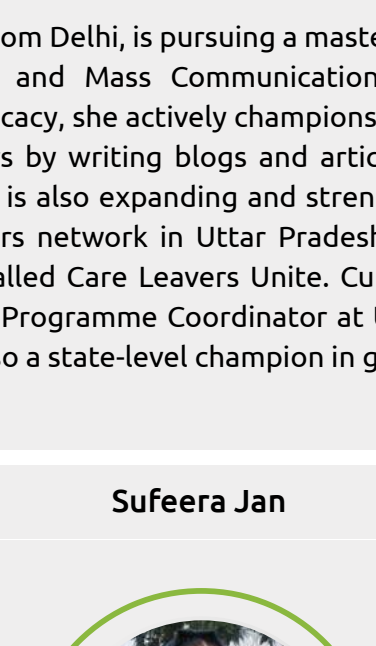

Rayees Ahmad Bhat



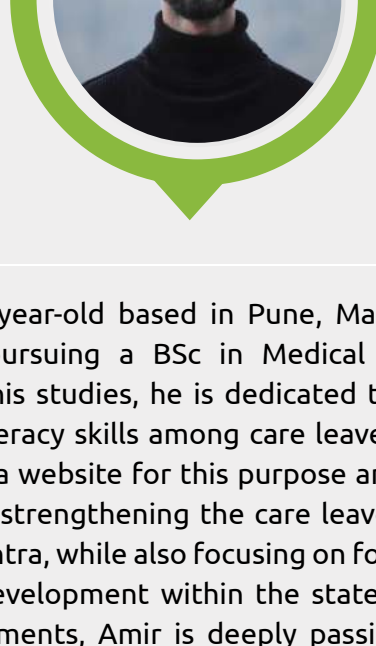

Sufiera Jan



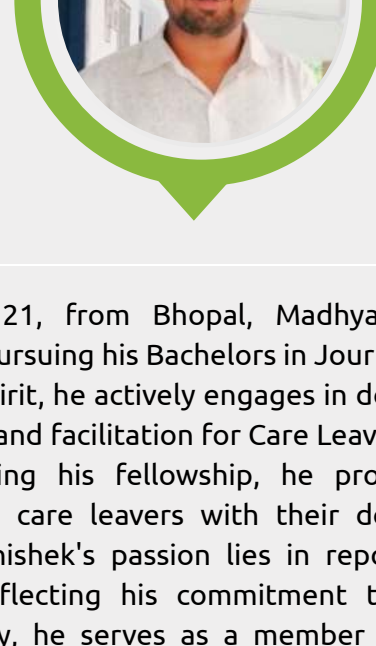

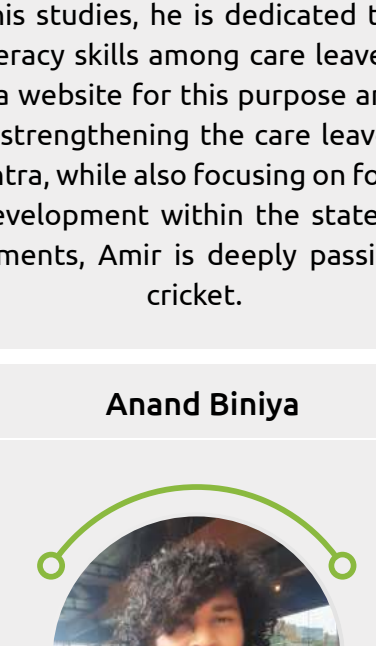
Shweta Gupta

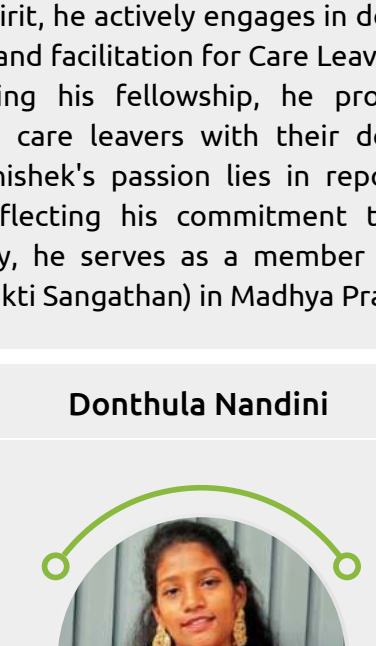

Amir Chopan



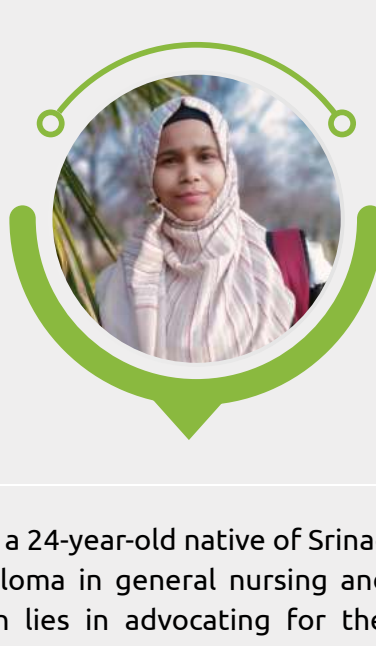

Abhishek Sonare



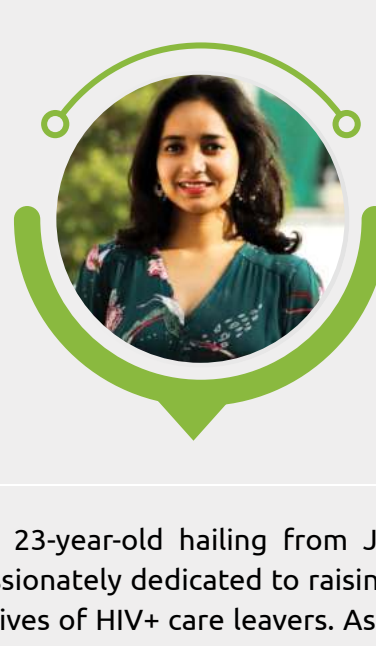

Anand Biniya



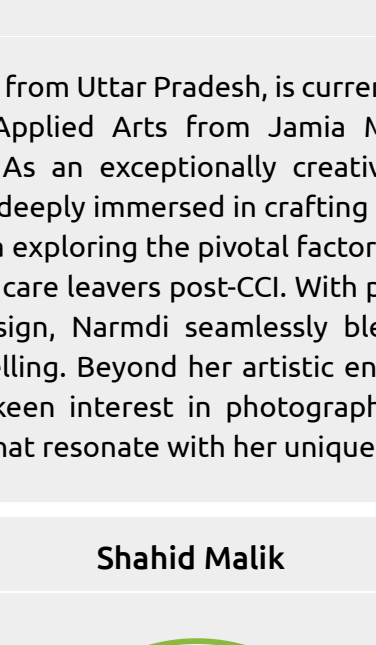

Donthula Nandini



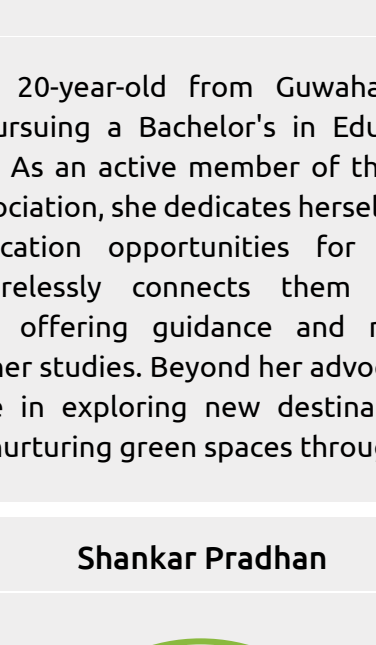

Narmdi



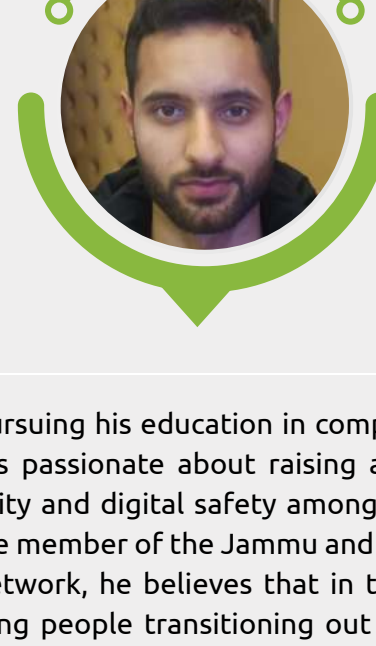

Priyanka Rai



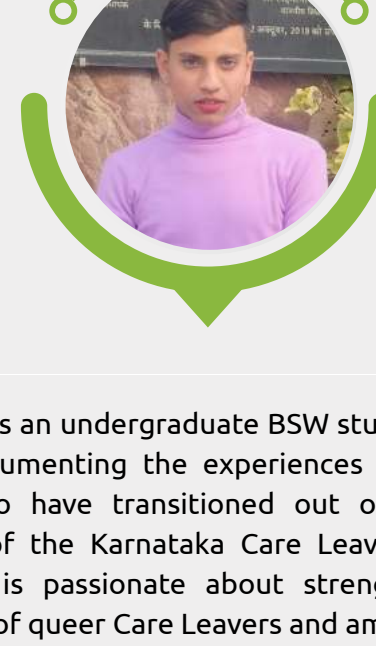

Shahid Malik



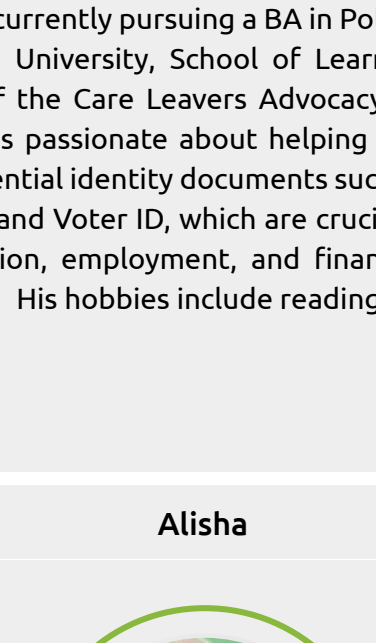

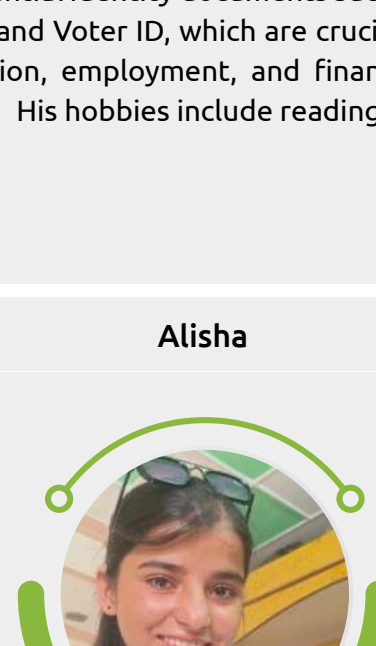
Sujit Kumar Nanda

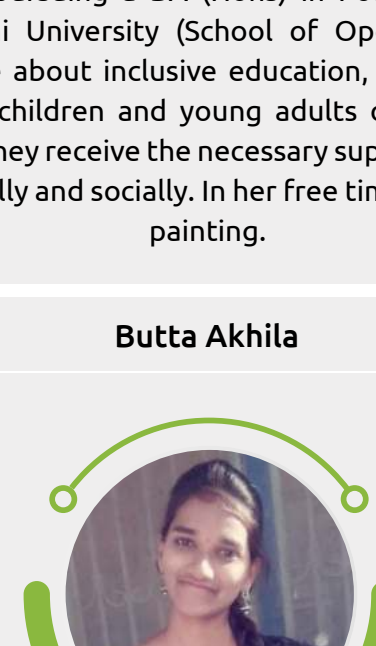

Aamir Shamim



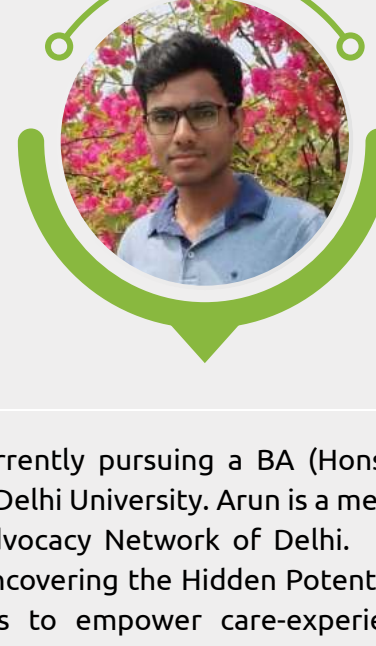

Rajkumar Sharma



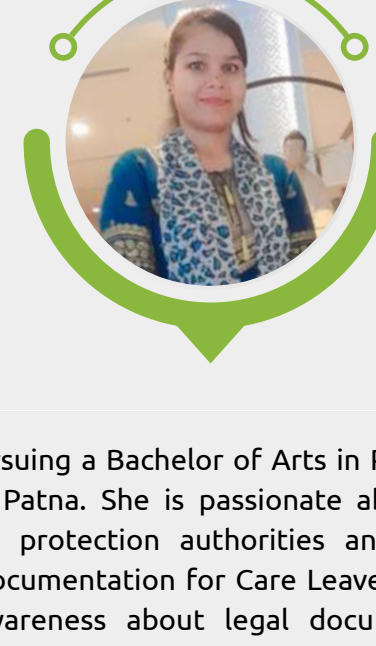

Lakshay



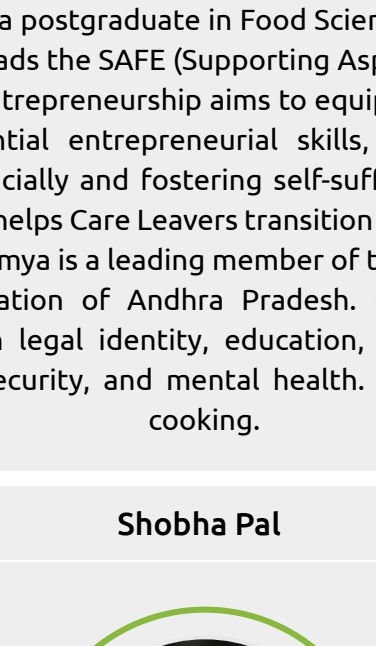

Laiba



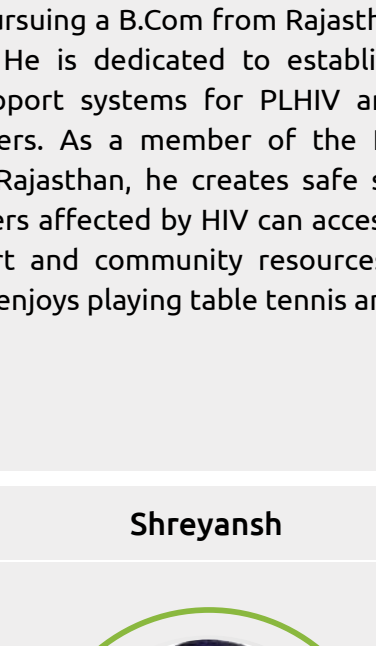

Alisha



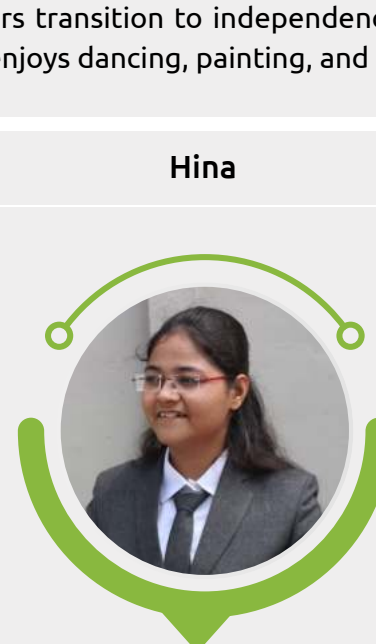

Butta Akhila



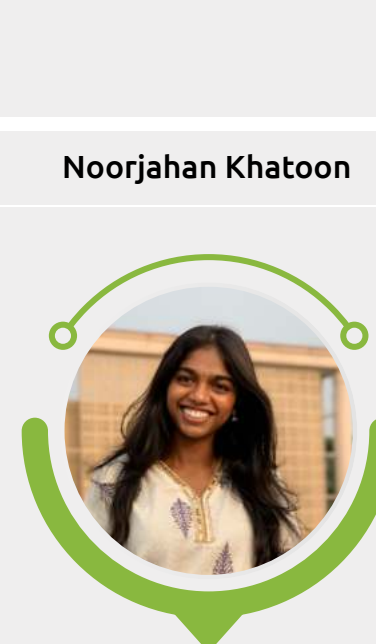

Arun



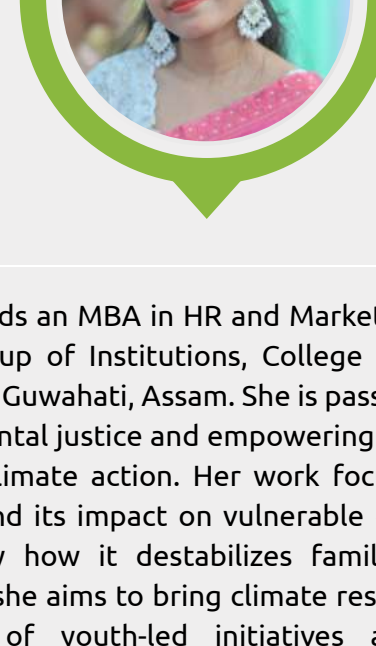
