We firmly believe in instilling a sense of responsibility and patriotism in the youth. With the shared goal of "Nation First, Always First," we celebrated the 77th Independence Day at 21 Udayan Care IT centers. The day was marked by various activities, including decorating the center premises with a tricolour theme, a social media post design competition, and skits highlighting the efforts of social reformers to address specific social issues. Over 950 students currently enrolled in our IT courses came together to celebrate the day and spread happiness.



# **3rd Typing Speed Competition**

Every student getting ready for a career needs to be able to use digital devices efficiently. Typing is one of those skills that must be developed through training and repetition. Therefore at Udayan Care IT Program, we give importance to students learning to type – speedily and without mistakes.

We continued our series by organizing the 3rd typing speed competition at Udayan Care's head office on September 23, 2023. A total of 59 students who had completed a Data Entry Operator course at Udayan Care's

Executive (Tally Prime) at Udayan Care's nine IT centers in East Delhi, Noida, and Ghaziabad. Participants from Udayan Care's other programs, such as Udayan Shalini Fellowship and After Care Outreach, also took part.

The event was well-organized by a team of 22 IT center staff members, with support from Anjali Hegde (ED), Deepak Sharma (Trustee), Manoj Shrivastava (Program Head), Prashant Singh (Asst Dir - HR), and a volunteer Mr. Abhishek from HCL Tech.

The day concluded with excellent results, as 167 students were selected, and more than 70 youths qualified for the final round, with job opportunities as data operators, backend support, tally support executives, etc., offering a monthly salary ranging from Rs. 10,000 to 14,000 initially.

IT centers participated with the goal of winning the competition. Five alumni from different centers, now successfully pursuing careers in the growing sector, joined to motivate these young champions.

The competition was thoughtfully organized, ensuring each student had the opportunity to showcase their skills. Shivam, a student from the Vinod Nagar IT Centre, set a new record and emerged as the winner of the 3rd typing speed competition. He was awarded a gold medal and a 1000 rupees voucher by Mr. Manoj Shrivastava, the head of the Udayan Care IT Centre program. Saurabh, a student from the Dundahera IT Centre, secured the 1st runner-up position, receiving a silver medal and a 700 rupees voucher. Ram Avatar, a student from the Loni IT Centre, earned a bronze medal and a 500 rupees voucher.

#### **USF Induction Selection Process 2023-24**

The Udayan Shalini Fellowship conducted a selection process in 34 locations across the country for the 2023-24 batch. Written exams, interviews, home visits, and induction occurred in August and September. In the last two months, ten chapters (Haridwar, North Delhi, Panchkula, Vadodara, West Mumbai, Aurangabad, Agra, Gurugram, Dehradun, and Aligarh) completed their selection process, inducting 490 new Shalinis into the fold.

Ms. Radhika conducted an informative menstrual hygiene session, providing guidance on the monthly cycle and explaining various hygiene products like sanitary napkins, tampons, and menstrual cups. This session not only enhanced women's well-being but also empowered Shalinis with knowledge about their health. The Shalinis received free sanitary pads, ensuring access to essential hygiene products.

# **LIFT Fellowship - Impact Stories**

#### Manisha

Manisha has been actively dedicated to addressing the challenges faced by HIV-positive care leavers, particularly those who are among the most marginalized in society. As a care leaver herself, she has personally encountered the numerous obstacles confronting HIV-positive youth, often experiencing discrimination from the broader community. Her endeavours encompass not only raising awareness but also educating fellow care leavers with HIV about ART therapy, health monitoring, and the importance of palliative care in enhancing their Quality of Life (QOL). Her ability to connect her own experiences with her mission as a LIFT fellow has facilitated her transformation from being a care leaver to becoming a leading advocate in her field. Manisha recently received recognition when she was chosen as the sole representative from Rajasthan for the regional consultation organized by Human Touch in collaboration with UNAIDS and AHF. This consultation aims to engage young key affected populations in India in the context of the HIV response. Her pioneering work in this realm sets her apart, and her advocacy on behalf of HIVpositive care leavers is gaining increasing prominence and acknowledgment.

#### **INTRAC Conference**

Dr. Kiran Modi, our Managing Trustee and Elected INTRAC member, presented the Indian Aftercare situation and legal framework at the INTRAC Steering Group Meeting on September 12, 2023, at the University of Sussex in Brighton, England. The meeting featured a short film showcasing the voices of care leavers, highlighting their experiences

delivered by care-experienced youth and a coalition of organizations. Guided by а care-experienced group, reference care leavers advocated for themselves and spoke on behalf of the millions of young worldwide who experienced the challenges institutionalization.

This event gathered 400+ delegates, both in-person and online, including practitioners, government representatives, academics, and care leavers from Asia. They discussed care reform, children's rights, and emerging trends. Dr. Kiran Modi, the Founder and Managing Trustee of Udayan Care, delivered opening and closing remarks. Ranjana Srivastava presented an overview of community approaches in India, while Surja and Rakesh shared their experiences and challenges as care leavers.

# FiT Families Together as a model at G20 Changemaker20 Submit

FiT Families Together, in collaboration with the Connecting Dreams Foundation, participated in the "Changemaker20 Summit" associated with G20, focusing on "Economic Inclusion and Poverty Alleviation". 137 nations came together to address global challenges during this online event.

The FiT project's involvement showcased how family-strengthening interventions contribute to Sustainable Development Goal 1 (SDG-1) by presenting real-life case stories of individuals and communities benefiting from the project. These stories underscored the effectiveness of family strengthening in combating poverty and promoting economic inclusion. In 2022, India launched Mission Vatsalya, a child protection policy focusing on stakeholder convergence and innovative child protection practices. Inspired by this policy, FiT Families Together organized five stakeholder meetings in Delhi, engaging various participants, including legal bodies (CWC, DCPU, DCPCR), community members, NGOs, teachers, healthcare providers, and more. These meetings aim to create a unified platform for resolving crises and providing essential services, education, counseling, healthcare, life skills training, and recreational activities. The FiT Families Together project believes this approach positively impacts children and families, promoting family strengthening and unity, benefiting the entire community.
